A Guide To Proper Storage of Hazardous Products

Read the Product Label

Product labels can tell you 4 key facts:

1. How to use the product properly, including cautions and hazards
2. How to store the product safely
3. First Aid instructions
4. Emergency phone numbers



RULES OF SAFE STORAGE

1. Store products out of reach of children and consider a locking cabinet.
2. Follow product storage directions carefully.
3. Keep hazardous products out of the elements.
Do NOT store products in direct sunlight, in areas that could become wet, or areas not well ventilated.
4. Always keep hazardous products in their original container.
5. If using an alternative container, make sure it is clearly labeled and the labeling of any former

Be Prepared

1. Have the poison center hotline posted in your home and programmed into your cell phone **1-800-222-1222**.
2. Have your doctor's office phone number posted or programmed into your cell phone.
3. Know where the closest Hospital and Emergency Room is.



Dispose Of Unused Or Damaged Products

Unused and damaged products can create an unnecessary hazard in the household.

Periodically look through your household products and make sure they are still needed and have not expired.

Unnecessary products can be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Collections. See bottom of sheet for more details.
