Provisional 2021-2022 Aerial Imagery for New Hampshire

NH Granit, the statewide GIS clearinghouse at the University of New Hampshire, has published 4-band, 6" orthoimagery web service. This statewide data collection effort was led by the NH Department of Transportation in partnership with other state agencies. The data are in the



public domain and can be used without restriction in ESRI and open-source GIS software. Users should note that this is an early release of the data; changes to the data and outages to the web service may occur. Please contact <u>Sara Siskavich</u> with any questions.



October's Planners Lunch & Learn Recap

The NRPC October Planner's Lunch & Learn was a success. Attendees learned from Katherine Heck, Government Finance Advisor with the NH Municipal Association about the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), a process that results in a comprehensive plan that identifies goals, strategies, and how to fund expenditures. Simply put, the CIP is critical. It creates an integrated multi-year improvement plan for all departments in a municipality, and implements both short-term and long-term strategies. Attendees learned techniques to connect the CIP to the budget for successful implementation in the future.

Brookline HOP Grant Update

NRPC staff has been working with the Town of Brookline to update the Vision, Housing, and Land Use chapters of their master plan. The process kicked off with a town-wide survey in September that received more than 380 responses. Two public forums were held in October to gather more feedback from residents. Next, staff will use that feedback to begin updating the content of the chapters.

This project is being funded by a Housing Opportunity Planning (HOP) grant that the Town of Brookline applied for and received from the State.
